hardware costs - Servers and storage hardware can be expensive. Redundant hardware for business continuity purposes can double these costs. However, the cloud offers an entirely different model for creating a reliable and redundant infrastructure without having to do it all in-house. By moving storage and operational computing to the cloud, small

Meeting peak demands means capex spending for capacity that may go unused the majority of the time. By moving to the cloud, you can ramp up and back off usage as demand requires. No more investment in partially used capacity.
- 3. Support No small firm can afford the 24/7 in-house IT support that is ideal for a fully monitored and secure infrastructure. Wth cloud utilization, you are outsourcing the support staff to your cloud service provider. As with hardware, you enjoy economies of scale by sharing the support costs with other users.
- 4. Reliability Because you benefit from the highly secured and supported environment the cloud services provide, you protect your clients from the downtime that would likely occur if your own infrastructure were to become disabled for any reason. UPS protection, mirrored storage, and highly sophisticated data security protocols mean that your business is safer from disaster and external threats than if you were to maintain it all on-site.
